

The MC GREEN project aims applies the internationally recognised ISO 17024 standard to ensure quality assurance in micro-credentials within European vocational education. Based on an analysis of ISO requirements and current VET practices, two innovative micro-credential programmes in the green economy will be tested.

Definition of Pre-conditions and Entry Requirements

PRE-CONDITION AND ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- There is a requirement for a list of Pre-conditions and Entry Requirements for Certification Candidates (ie. pre-reviewed literature/pre-qualification achieved).
- The list may include the average workload (learning units/hours)
 needed for admission.

IMPORTANT FEATURES

- Pre-conditions and Entry Requirements should be appropriate to the certified competence and intended NQF.
- They should be agreed with the Steering Board for the Single Certification Programme.
- They should not be overly difficult, timeconsuming or expensive.
- They are dependent on the competencies to be certified.

WHAT TO BE AWARE OF

- The aim of both is to maintain quality standards and trustworthiness in the Certification.
- If there is a requirement for a certain prequalification/training programme, that **VET provider** would need to be approved as a training institute.
- This offer must also transfer to all other VET providers who wish to prepare learners for the certification process.
